


### Kindergarten A and B

#### Grade 3 and 4

Throughout the Unit, they looked into various jobs, occupations, and responsibilities, deepening their understanding of the business world by learning about products and services, supply and demand, as well as profit and loss.





Switching gears to the Biodiversity Unit, students embarked on a Mini Zoo activity, working collaboratively as zookeepers responsible for managing specific animal sections. They shared comprehensive information about the different species, including their names, characteristics, habitats, diets, conservation status, and intriguing facts. As a culminating activity, students creatively crafted Plantable Seed Paper from newspapers, demonstrating their commitment to environmental sustainability.



### Grade 5-6 PYP Exhibition



Under the theme 'How We Express Ourselves', Grade 5 and 6 students embarked on an inspiring journey of research and exploration, focusing on art, fashion and gaming. They presented insightful findings that showcased their critical thinking and analytical skills.

Fashion enthusiasts among our students delved into the world of design, exploring different patterns, and styles. #### Grade 7: French

In term 4, the grade 7 students in their French class used the theme of "Vue, de mieux se connaître – Knowing ourselves better", to explore their own historical familial roots. They shared the information they learnt about their families' history with their peers through the creation of a family tree and by presenting their posters to their peers in class. This way, students were able to deepen their learning of the French language, expand their vocabulary and practice their communication skills, while at the same time strengthen their bonds in class by learning more about each other.





### Grade 8: Design





In today's modern world, where brands dominate our daily lives, it is essential for students to understand the concept of brand identity. During Term 4, grade 8 students delved into the world of brand identity, acquiring a comprehensive understanding of the elements that contribute to a strong and cohesive brand. ### Grade 9: English

Grade 9 students were introduced to the concept of podcasts. In their previous unit, students had created stories with a cultural theme, which they further developed into a podcast. This podcast was a recorded event, hosted by the dynamic duo of Charlotte and Zahra. All wore traditional clothes, based on their story themes with the scenic backdrop of YIS for the podcast. Students answered questions about the creative journey in creating their stories.







During the process of writing their stories, everyone faced their own struggles; like writer's block and finding new vocabulary, but they overcame these hurdles and composed dynamic stories. Effort and persistence pays dividend in the end. We were impressed to see how our our students overcame their obstacles and wrote astounding stories. The chosen themes gave us an insight into cultures and traditions from across the globe. Most stories involved Asian cultures, but none of the stories had a similar plot, which made each story unique and worthy of reading. Asking our fellow students questions helped us to better grasp their stories and how well thought-out they were, their costumes displayed an imaginative transition of cultures, which was loved by everyone.





### Grade II: Physics

This term 4, the Grade 11 physics students were learning about the topic of Thin Film Interference. Thin film interference causes the iridescence seen in many everyday objects we can find in the home and in nature. For example we can find this phenomenon in nature on peacock feathers, in glossy flower petals, in soap bubbles, and the shiny side of a CD.



This phenomenon occurs when light waves reflecting off the top and bottom surfaces of a thin film which interfere with one another, creating a rainbow pattern of colours. The thin-film interference depends on the thickness of the film, light wavelength and refractive indices. An important application of thin film interference in the real world is in manufacturing of optical instruments. The precise grinding and polishing of a lens or mirror, allows it to be shaped to an accuracy of less than a wavelength over its entire surface.



### Grade 12: Visual Art Exhibition

The Visual Art Exhibition is a culmination of the art portfolio of the grade 11 and 12 students who follow the IBDP Visual Art course, and a celebration of their accomplishments. The artwork that the students presented is the selected products created during the two-year program. During the courses, the students had a chance to be a real artist including sustained investigation and personal and cultural reflection.




### Spring Picnic




### Theory of Knowledge Exhibition
